It is the fuel that allows common people to attain uncommon results." And closed by sharing the words of novelist and Nobel Prize winner, Pearl S. Buck: "The secret of joy in work is contained in one word - excellence. To know how to do something well is to enjoy it."

Grow Your Own Nurse Practitioner

The MHA received approval from the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care for funding to support a Grow Your Own Nurse Practitioner Program. Lesa Marsh, former director of patient care at Strathroy and Four Counties, is currently on an educational leave of absence and enrolled in the Primary Health Care Nurse Practitioner (PHCNP) Certificate Program at the University of Western Ontario. The funding approval confirms the partnership between Marsh, the MHA and the Ministry. Announced in February of this year, the Ministry's Grow Your Own Nurse Practitioner initiative addresses the shortage of primary-care providers, especially in rural and remote communities, by supporting the training of more nurse practitioners. Marsh will start her new career as a Nurse Practitioner at FCHS next September.





Holiday Help

"Happy Holidays" is a common phrase and one that is usually stated with warm wishes and good intentions. But the holidays can be a difficult time for some people coping with mental health challenges. The stress of the season can bring some situations to a crisis.

Search Community Mental Health Services is a local not-for-profit organization that assists people in west Middlesex County with Mental Health difficulties. Since August they have provided an on-call Crisis Response Team, primarily on weekends, to the ER department at MHA's Strathroy site. "Providing assistance to those in mental health crisis," is the mandate of the Response Team says Vicky Stevens, Executive Director of Search Community Mental Health Services.

This holiday season, the Crisis Response Team will be available to Strathroy Middlesex General Hospital from December 22 at 4pm until January 2 at 8 am – providing around the clock coverage.

The service is a benefit to the SMGH Emergency department. "It's a tremendous support to our ER department because the Crisis Team are skilled at mental health crisis management," Mike Mazza, CEO of MHA says. "This is a excellent example of how MHA meets patients needs through working with our community partners."



Liz Watson, clinical leader on 1 South Medical, spoke with nursing students at the University of Western Ontario Nursing Job Fair on October 23rd.

Representing the MHA, Watson and Sharon Cattrysse, site director for FCHS, displayed the new MHA recruitment banner and distributed new recruitment brochures. Exhibitors from southeastern and southwestern Ontario and the northern United States attended the fair.

On the Radio

The MHA advertises on local radio stations to announce new programs, encourage good health and inform the public about our changes and successes. And people are listening!

Over the summer, the MHA ran radio ads about the Diabetes Education Centres (DEC) at both FCHS and SMGH sites. They highlighted the seriousness of diabetes – it can cause blindness, serious kidney and heart disease, and shorten lives – and pointed out that it runs in some families. The ads stressed the importance of being informed and learning to manage diabetes,



through the DEC. The ads also explained that DEC programs are free, and are accessible through physician referrals, referrals by other health professionals or self-referrals.

One local listener heard an ad as he drove to work. He had just visited his doctor, and been told that he had borderline diabetes, so he e-mailed the hospital to ask for more information and find out how he could access the DEC to learn more about his condition – and how to manage it.

For this listener the ad was just what he needed to hear!
